OVERVIEW: On a stunning, world-class site along the east coast of Mexico’s Baja Peninsula near the historic town of Loreto, Rees Jones has crafted a brilliant, multi-themed golf course accented by valleys, arroyos, dunes, and foothills. Holes feature panoramic views of Danzante Bay, the Sea of Cortes, the Islands of Loreto, and the Sierra de la Giganta mountain range.

The golf course – which debuted with 11 holes in 2016 and was completed in 2017 – serves as a prime amenity for guests and homeowners at Villa del Palmar Beach Resort & Spa, a full-service destination resort community.

CONSTRUCTION:

Construction started on February 6, 2014 and was done in two phases: holes 1, 9-18 with practice facility were first. The course was open for play as an 11-hole round.

Hole 17 was moved to where it is now November 2014.

The second phase started November 16, 2016 on holes 2-8.

Grand opening was December 8, 2017.

PRACTICE FACILITY:

The spacious practice facility, which features a dedicated short game area, has a beautiful sea view. The expansive nine-hole putting course was inspired by the famed Himalayas putting course in St. Andrews, Scotland.

FEES:

\$203 (includes cart and all taxes) for eighteen holes

RESORT AMENITIES:

Villa del Palmar takes full advantage of the region's unique beauty, authentic culture, quiet beaches, scenic vistas, rich history, and natural habitats.

The resort offers guest access to unparalleled sporting opportunities, including world-class fishing, hiking, mountain biking, horseback riding, swimming, paddle boarding, kayaking, and whale watching.

Complimentary shuttle service enables guests to explore historic Loreto and visit the 1697 mission that made the town famous.

The area is also known for its wildlife, including 900 species of fish off the coast in an area that has been declared a World Heritage Site. Hotel perks include a spa and fitness center, salsa dance lessons, and movie nights for children.

TRAVEL ACCESS:

Alaska Airlines offers flights (two hours) from Los Angeles to the Islands of Loreto. Aero Calafia provides service from Tijuana, and West Jet from Calgary, Canada.

The resort is located 20 miles south of Loreto and four hours north of La Paz, capital of Baja California Sur.
