DESCRIPTION:

Each course follows the natural beauty and contours of the land for 36 holes of unparalleled Rocky Mountain golf. The two courses are strikingly different in feel while complimenting each other well in playing style. At an average 7,200 feet in elevation, the courses wind through stunning granite formations, glacially striated cliffs, peaks that rise to 14,000 feet

and towering Ponderosa forests.

Enjoyed by golfers of all levels, the masterful Arthur Hills and Hale Irwin/Todd Schoeder routings wind through streams and lakes in an idyllic setting as they change elevation. Each course presents different challenges, topography, scenery and vistas.
