CBS Sports Commentator Jim Nantz Named Honoree For 11th Annual The Langley: A Tribute to Legends

Pebble Beach Resident to be Recognized at Charity Event Benefitting PGA HOPE

PEBBLE BEACH, Calif. (June 19, 2018)– CBS Sports Commentator and Pebble Beach resident Jim Nantz will be honored Aug. 20-21, 2018 at “The Langley: A Tribute to Legends,” an annual charity event at Pebble Beach Resorts benefitting PGA HOPE (Helping Our Patriots Everywhere).

Now in its 11th year, The Langley is a two-day event featuring An Evening with Golf’s Legends, where attendees meet and greet with honorees at The Inn at Spanish Bay, followed the next day by a The Langley Charity Pro-am tournament at the world-renowned Pebble Beach Golf Links, with the awards luncheon attended by players, honorees, and Langley family members.



Nantz joins the ranks of golf greats such as Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus, and Billy Casper, among others who have received recognition for their contributions to golf in years past.

“It is humbling to receive this honor, which has gone to so many great legends in the game, at such a special occasion named for a man who was a gift to us all,” said Nantz, who now lives at Pebble Beach and was a longtime friend of Jim Langley. “I could not feel more blessed by this.”

A three-time Emmy Award winner and five-time National Sportscaster of the Year, Nantz has covered virtually every sport for the CBS Television Network since joining it in 1985. Best known in golf for his work at The Masters, Nantz, 59, also has been the anchor at the 18th hole of the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am for more than 20 years.

Funds raised from The Langley benefit PGA HOPE, a program that provides free golf lessons to disabled and able-bodied military veterans as a therapeutic tool to help improve their mental, social, physical, and emotional wellbeing. PGA HOPE is the only golf Veterans golf program taught by PGA Professionals who receive special training in adaptive golf teaching methods.
